EXTENDED EMPLOYMENT

The **Extended Employment** program provides supported employment services for individuals with severe mental health and/or physical disabilities. Longterm vocational support is provided to individuals who work in competitive jobs in the community or in community work teams supervised by AAI Team Members.

MATERIAL RECYCLING FACILITY


The MRF was successfully moved and right sized with a new manager and is seeing steady profit by improving efficiencies. MN State contract renewed for 5 additional years.


